Meeting's Report; 9 October 2018

Guests welcomed tonight were: Judith & Rob Sloan, Alison Chiam, and Inductees: Guy Porter and partner Julie. Guest Speakers: Elizabeth Abood and Skipper Kevin Hill of Jervis Bay Wild.

President Craig Saunders updated members on previous night's Board Meeting discussions and decisions; Jumping castle replacement decision was postponed by the Board, Pres Craig expressed his and the Board's appreciation of the investigation effort put in by my Tony Fondacaro and his team; Phil Brown and Leonie Smith.

Pres Craig summarized the District Conference he attended with PDG Glenn Wran and recommended all members would enjoy attending and appreciate the various presentations, such as; 7 Women Project, Survivor's Support Group and First Aid Mental Health. Pres Craig advised that the Board would be looking further into First Aid Mental Health due to the potential to be effective in our schools and Community.

Members were informed that a donation of \$1,500 of our "Farm Aid Fund" would be made to the local farm aid group led by Kirili Dowling to provide water to farmers in need as there were no operational overheads. The Board also decided to investigate further alternatives farm aid projects, Issa will lead this review and report to members.

PP Dick Crouch reported on his Committee's review of the Business Awards questioning the value to the Club and Community anticipating change in the future.



PP Phil Brown advised that in his absence the coordination of the Club's involvement in the Relay for Life on November 17th will rest with **Ian Tibbles** and that the walk will be a 9am to 9pm affair.

Community Services Director Emile Jansen had been meeting with the Ulladulla Suicide Working Group and reported that Local Council is taking over the Warden Head to conduct a review and that working with local schools might emerge as a replacement project. However, on advice from PP John Hozack the original donation towards redevelopment of the Light House precinct would need to be discussed with the original donor before funds considered for alternative worthy projects.

President Craig inducted Guy Porter in the presence of partner Julie. Welcome both to Rotary and to the Rotary family.

Youth Director Andrea Tucker advised that one student had been supported to attend the Honeywell Science Forum. Andrea was also keen to hear more about Rotary International's 7 Women Project in Nepal in light of her own fund-raising Nepalese project, members will hear more about this in the future.

Guest Speakers, Elizabeth Abood and Captain Kevin Hill had plenty of time and some amazing images to inform members of the idyllic Jervis Bay Wild cruises. Jervis Bay Wild had expanded its fleet and now offer a wide range of trips and customized options for parties up to 120 inside the bay and 100 outside, including disable services. They even have seafood restaurant and café on the jetty that can be integrated with trips for a customised service.

In fact, members were so taken by Captain Kevin's descriptions that Tony has been commissioned to look at a Club trip. No doubt inspired a little by Captain Kevin's generous offer of a 20% discount to club member.
