Guest speaker Andrew Condie, from NSW Forestry Service, was one of two men from the South Coast to attend the recent Oregon's Klondike Wildfires. Over 150 firefighters from Australia went to USA to assist with the Klondike fires. Andrew informed members of the different categories of fires and who responds to which type of fire, Andrew also informed members, with NSW Forestry it depends on which category you are in to what you are called in to respond to.

Andrew explained that it was a six-week deployment to USA, he undergone training prior to departure and more training once arriving in Oregon. Andrew was deployed to the Klondike fire where he worked with the USA firefighters, their machineries and hotspot firefighters to gain the upper hand on the fire, in his area he was protecting not only homes but structures including a suspension bridge, which had to be protected at all costs. Andrew and his team came across some interesting industries, a meth lab, in the forest whilst fighting the fires, Andrew was then moved onto assisting in the clean up after the wildfires. Andrew has bought back to Australia some good ideas with the equipment used in firefighting in the USA and some of these ideas he has already put into place. Andrew was amazed at the equipment used in USA and some of their practices, he informed members that on average 18 wildfire fire fighters are lost every year in the USA and he stated that Australia and USA use very similar techniques to fight fires, though where in Australia he would say get out of here in the US they would stay on and fight the fires.
