Guest speakers Andrea Tucker & Jo Jones spoke on their adventure to Mt Everest Base Camp. Firstly, Andrea spoke on the Seven Women's project which was the reason that Andrea, Rod and Jo trek to the base camp of Mt Everest. Andrea gave the background on the Seven Women Project. The project assists women and young girls in gaining life skills including sewing and cooking just mention a few of the courses that the program offers. The program enables young girls and women to gain skills to earn a living and to be independent.

Nepal (attitude 2,860 metres) as there are no vehicles only yaks, donkeys and Sherpa's are used to carry items. Andrea explained the trek and how they worked their way along the trail to Mt Everest base camp. Walking over swing bridges and very rough trails Andrea explained that nothing was smooth or level, every trail went up then went down. The oxygen levels at the higher attitudes and the guides were taking oxygen levels every day of the group every day, how they were monitored daily to acclimatized to the attitude, stopped at tea houses which were made of mainly ply wood and where transported by Sherpa's on their backs, tea houses also double as accommodation. Andrea explained due to the attitude that the best way to acclimatize was to trek to the required attitude than go back down then trek back up to that attitude. The guides advised the group not to have meat after Lukla so the group went vegetarian for the remainder of the trek. Only being 6 hours from Base Camp Jo was extremely unwell and the decision was made for Jo to return by air to Kathmandu for medical treatment. Andrea and Rod were lucky to be able to stay a few nights at Base Camp (attitude 5,365 metres) than were flown out to Kathmandu.
