Report on meeting of 6 August 2019

Sergeant At Arms Ian Tibbles opened the meeting welcoming members and guest Rodney Tucker.

Guest Speaker Janey George from Milton Theatre committee, came with her husband George, and spoke on the history of the Milton Theatre, the most recent donation, the original movie projectors and the previous lessor of the theatre John Katsoulis.

Janey spoke on how in the early 90s the community of Milton gathered to form a committee to manage the theatre with many acts and stage show being performed at the theatre over the years. Janey spoke on

how in the early days of the theatre in 1929 the reels were being changed, there was live entertainment including woodchopping. Since the theatre has become an incorporated body, the committee tries to host performances two to three times a month.

The best night is to have an event is Saturday night, where people came from out of town, and book accommodations and dine out. The committee of the theatre did a recent survey of theatre goers and it showed that people came mostly from the Shoalhaven though some have come from the ACT & Sydney. Janey spoke on how all money raised from the theatre is returned to the theatre as there is always equipment to update and maintenance to be done. It is not for profit and they negotiate fees with artists.

The committee decides on the artist to perform at the theatre. Janey spoke on the stories of the resident ghost "Walter". The theatre has been used by the community including fundraisers where the theatre will come to an arrangement with pricing on the use of the theatre. The committee are hoping to continue to keep the theatre going as it is.

Some of the tickets for shows can be purchased at the Milton Leather shop which keeps seats for those not on the internet or prefer personal shopping.
