Report on meeting of 29 October 2019

The meeting was chaired by incoming President **Leonie Smith**, her first time chairing a club meeting. **Dale Wilford** proposed at toast to the Rotary Club of West Wyalong in anticipation of his representing our Club this weekend.

Trevor Schofield reported on the Men's Health Van 2-day visit to Ulladulla. Trevor thanked members who manned the van over the two days. In that time 82 people visited the van for health check. Health outcomes were 32 identified with elevated cholesterol; 10 were found to have high blood sugar levels; 33 with hypertension (6 were immediately referred to their GP).

Of the 82 people examined a majority were over 70 with the youngest being 21. Numbers attending were similar to other rural centres the van had visited recently.

Trevor thanked members who were rostered to man reception for the van; the ExServos Club for their catering and Rotarian Bernie Jones for helping with accommodation for medical staff.

Dale Wilford reported on the upcoming visit to Tallimba; he and **Brian Morrison** will take all the shoe boxes and cash vouchers to be distributed to locals, impacted by the drought for spending at local businesses.

Brian Morrison updated members on the Blessing of the Fleet Princess Ball with 29 young ladies attending their first briefing on December 4th it looks like being a success again.

Emile Jansen reported that 133 tickets have been sold for the Comedy night; he is hoping for a further 60 ticket sales.

Tim Gregory updated us on the Christmas trees, 640 trees are available but have been impacted by the dry conditions with a number of smaller than average trees amongst the crop despite his watering when possible. Unfortunately, town water is used and will be quite costly this year, Tim estimating a water bill of around \$1,000. Members offered to assist Tim whenever necessary. The roster will be circulated soon.

All members commented on the high quality of the dinner and all hoped that similar meals would be offered at future meetings.
