


































Youth Report

The Seven Women organisation is a United Nations Rotary International Responsible Business Award recipient. An Australian founded organisation, Seven Women empowers marginalised women and children in Nepal through education and employment.

In May 2019, I trekked to Base Camp Mt Everest with 12 colleagues and decided to fundraise for this particular charity. We raised over \$4,000 in which every \$250 pays for one student to attend school for one year, including books and food. Thank you to our local club as a substantial portion of funds were raised each week from fines, donations, ticket sales. We certainly have made a considerable difference to so many people's lives.


5. DREAM CRICKET

Blessing of the Fleet Report

This year's Ulladulla Blessing of the Fleet Festival was set to be the largest yet, with a two week Phoenix Festival planned to tack onto the end of it.

Successful in obtaining a \$50,000 grant from NSW State and Federal Government, under the Bushfire Community Resilience and Economic Recovery Fund, after our region was ravaged by the Currowan fire for over two months, killing three people and destroying over eighty nine homes in the Conjola area.

Most businesses had recorded an unprecedented sales drop of 70% - 80% over the summer period. Disastrous for a seasonal tourism region who largely rely on summer trade to carry them over the winter. Three major sponsors pulled out.

The timing of these events would also coincide with the typical diagnosis of PTSD, three months after a traumatic event.

The symbol of the Phoenix represents rebirth, strength and resilience.

The Rise of the Phoenix Concert was set to launch the Ulladulla Blessing of the Fleet and Phoenix Festival, with a twelve hour, 'Big Day In' concert. Over seventeen bands and performers were locked in to perform for free at this mega event. It was to be held in the new auditorium of the Dunn Lewis Centre.

Two weeks of various events were to follow, incorporating as many local businesses and individuals impacted by the fires as possible.

The Ulladulla Phoenix Festival was to include people of all ages, with events ranging from Family Fishing Day, Kids Disco, Restaurant Theme Nights, Comedy Night, Live Music, Pub Poetry, Beach Yoga and much more, boosting the local economy and morale. Promoting community connectivity and alleviating any feelings of isolation.

Unfortunately, Covid19 hit Australia in March and lockdown laws were enforced. Events were no longer possible. One month out from the Blessing of the Fleet Ball and after hundreds of hours of work, all events were cancelled or postponed.

At the time of writing this report, the Shoalhaven City Council have held onto the \$50,000 grant, essentially freezing it.

Covid19 lockdown restrictions are starting to ease and Ball Chair, PP Brian Morrison is hopeful of holding the Ball later in the year for the twenty eight registered Princesses.

After speaking with some parents and previous Chair, PP Phillip Brown OAM, it may be possible to hold a combined parade with the 2020 and 2021 Princesses at next year's Blessing of the Fleet Festival. Fingers crossed restrictions of mass gatherings will be lifted and the Festival can go ahead next year.

It is the first time since 1956 that the historic Blessing of the Fleet Parade and Festival have had to be cancelled due to a health pandemic.

The Bushfires

During the latter part of 2019 and into early 2020 many from the RCMU rallied behind the call to help support local communities during the horrendous bushfires which ravaged our area.

From early morning starts to help feed our wonderful SES and RFS personnel, to taking a pivotal role in the unloading, sorting, storing and the distribution of donated foodstuffs, clothing and more.

Since the start of the year the RCMU has taken an ongoing co-ordination role to ensure that, in addition to the proceeds of last Christmas trees' sales, the tens of thousands of dollars which have been received and pledged are being fully allocated to support those directly affected by the fires.

This has been / will be achieved, and is ongoing, in three ways:

1. By way of monthly 'annuity' payments to particularly needy individuals, couples and families for the next 12 to 18 months;

2. Particular 'lump sum' and 'in kind' assistance (including tools of trade and two caravans!); and

3. Currently being implemented, a system of monetary vouchers to be provided to those in need and which can be spent only at designated local businesses.
