The End Trachoma project started in SA moving to WA and now in the NT. In the NT the project has moved from Alice Springs to the Barkly Shire.

Educating the remote areas of Australia on hygiene. The End Trachoma project is covering all areas of Hygiene from washing machines, inside toilets, clean water trailers and hygiene products.

All projects have been asked for by the communities. Future plans is the employment an Environmental Health Worker in the NT. As the End Trachoma project have reached its target of 2,000 toiletries kits for the NT.

End trachoma project have worked on a number of projects and are still working on projects towards ending trachoma in Australia as trachoma is a third world disease and Australia is a first world country and is the only first world in the world with trachoma.
