19 May 2021 Meeting;

Report from Combined Meeting with Apex and Lions members in attendance.

President Leonie welcomed Rotarians, Apex and Lions members.

Each club President gave a short report on the activities of their respective clubs.

Rotary has been active with working bees, starting the Community Chest at the Ulladulla Resource centre, hosting the SESCA awards in June, assisting with Bushfire meals, Disaster Centre and recovery, donating monies raised from the sales of the Christmas Trees to SES, NSW Ambulance service and mental health activities for the local community. Early in the year Rotary donated radios to Milton Rural Fire Service. Hosting the Community Christmas BBQ at Rotary Park. Conducting the Blessing of the Fleet Princess Formal.

Lions has also been busy with the running of markets at Mollymook and the Farmer markets at Burrill Lake Lions Park. Hosting Australia Day and continuing programs with selling of the Lions mints, Fruit cake and the Spectacle's program. The Lions bookshop is still continuing raising much needed funds for the Jindelara Respite House, the respite house was a joint service project between Lions, Rotary and Apex. Finally, the Lion's Den is operating next to the Dunn Lewis Centre.

Apex have been quietly achieving the background. Assisting with providing food at the Excavation Centre on the 31/12/2019, also assisting Lions with the placing of the Santa Claus's around town and being trained by the Late Alan MacDonald from Lions with this project. Hosting the Fathering project Paper planes and pizza night where over 400 Father's and their children attended (before COVID-19), continuing with the positive Father's project with a community camping weekend the first of these camps to be held in July, bringing young children together for a positive experience. Continuing with the hiring of Bushwalking beacons from Milton IGA, hosting the Beer Festival at Milton Showground in October this year. Also assisting at Safe waters house in Ulladulla.

Apexian Matt Dell then spoke on the Community Connect Network and how the organisation is assisting volunteer groups in the area find assistance and connecting groups together. Working towards collaborating organisations together in the area.
