Guest Speaker Kate Sullivan talked about her work journey in Ulladulla, Sydney and now in Saudi Arabia.

Kate was involved with Rotary by attending RYLA and 2010 RYLA International in Montreal as well as the Rotary Convention.

Kate worked at Tuckerbag in Ulladulla, Times newspaper, worked for Rural Press, News Limited and Fairfax, Sate Government where Kate worked with various ministers and in 2013 was consulting for government departments.

In 2014 while attending the G20 in Brisbane, Kate was approached by delegates from Saudi Arabia to work in the desert Kingdom as a media consultant - journalist. Kate lives in Riyadh, where westerners and locals live in same building, suburbs. Kate spoke on streets and malls which are amazing, women allowed to drive, women have to dress modestly and how in general Saudis are very proud and passionate about their country.

In 2018 tourist visas were granted in Saudi Arabia, to show the world their history, want a Global Presence in Mena (middle east countries) and in 2020 the G20, with 3,000 international media personnel, was to take place in Riyadh but thanks to COVID it turned into a virtual G20 summit. Saudis have a long-term vision from 2020 to 2030, includes tourism, resorts, hospitalities, Saudi Cup a two-day event with the world biggest prize money, future Kate's involvement; Indonesian G20 in 2022 and Indian in 2023.
