The Ulladulla Campus opened in December 2021 and has 69 students currently enrolled at the Campus and signing up students on a regular basis.

The Country University encourages networking between businesses and Universities.

There are over 1600 students enrolled through the Country Universities Centres in regional Australia.

The Country Universities Centre don't offer degrees though will support students with studies when the student has found the University that offers the degree the student is looking for via Distance education.

Providing students, a Learning community, Academic, administration, tech, wellbeing support services and it's all free as Country Universities Centre are funded through State and Federal Government's.
