September is Rotary's Basic Education and Literacy month



President Beck opened the meeting and welcomed members and guests **Claire Davies** and the Davies' guest for the night, retired army colonel **Scott Gills**.

This was followed by a minute's silence to mark the passing of the Queen.

Brian Morrison proposed the **Rotary Toast**, and Beck proposed the **Loyal Toast** to King Charles.

A discussion on the **Regionalisation** proposal from RI was then held. President Beck informed the meeting that the Board had arrived at a qualified and reluctant approval of the scheme. As near as the Board could ascertain, the plan is to do away with Districts and establish a Regional Council comprising one member from each of the hundreds of Clubs in the Region. How that might operate is a mystery, as it will be impossible to send a delegate to such a large body – assuming it ever meets:

- Most of the comments from the floor were somewhat negative, turning on the absence of detail and the inability to see one benefit for changing something which does not appear to need the major changes outlined;
- Notice having been duly served to the Members, and a quorum being present, a vote was taken and it was decided that the Rotary Club of Milton-Ulladulla will NOT PARTICIPATE in the trial; and the President be instructed thereby to vote in the negative.

GUEST: Gareth Davies introduced **Scott Gills** who, after 30 years in the Australian Army, retired as a colonel in the Intelligence branch and is now having a second career with Microsoft. Scott told us how he entered the Army as a teenager and how carefully he was trained and developed, first as a tank commander and then in intelligence, which he describes as the coordinated acquisition and analysis of information to help and support commanders to make the right decisions at the right time and the right place. He led us through his 14 postings in 30 years from Timor and Bougainville to Iraq and Afghanistan, with side trips seconded to the US where he experienced the American way of doing things. When he retired as deputy commander of Defence, Sigint and Cyber, he was in command of a unit with 300 staff.
