Cathy Mason, (photo on the right) from the RC of Caringbah, talked about her club's and District's project such as Rotary Care Packs, Markets, Adopt-a-tree and the 26 July; National Lamington Day; find a baker, sell the lamingtons to local businesses and the Rotary Club makes a 50 percent profit.

Milton Ulladulla United Hospital Auxiliary's has 40 members and Judy Bond is the President who spoke on their fundraising such as the Bunnings' BBQ, monthly street stall and pop-up shop in Rowen's Arcade. The members have put a library in the hospital, supply patients with toothbrush-paste and combs, supply clothing so patients can get out of bed and spend time in the lounge or dining room to feel better and members do patients visitation for company, support or just to chat with the patients. Auxiliary members liaise with Stuart Emslie to get the hospital wish list (items needed which will benefit the community), they provided a tranquillity room for hospital staff, where they can have a timeout, the room was furbished with furniture donated by FurnitureOne, pots and plants donated by Bunnings.

Stuart Emslie, MU Hospital Director of Nursing and Midwifery Services, addressed the club, he lives with his wife and kids in our area, loves volunteering, he addressed the club back in 2014 on enhancing the humanly experience for the patients, family and staff.

Amongst Stuart's achievements were the Renal Unit, opened in 2017, so patients can have dialysis here locally, the purchase of an ultrasound machine, the staff wellbeing program arising after the bushfires, the staff tranquillity garden (an outdoor area for hospital staff).

Stuart said that he has a connected team and well united in partnership with the hospital auxiliary. Stuart soke on the operating theatre, birthing at the hospital and COVID vaccination.

The hospital auxiliary requires a computer, President Bernie helped by **Guy Porter** (Tech Hub, formerly CompuPort, in Rowens Arcade) will cover the cost.
