# 14 February 2023; visit to the Community Resource Centre

Thirteen members and one partner visited the Ulladulla and Districts Community Resources Centre in St Vincent Street and also visited the Fossil House in Green Street.

Thank you to Ross Wade for arranging the evening and gave us a tour of the Centre, Ross also organised a platter, thank you to Maria Mitchell, the Centre's manager – coordinator, and to Phil Smart for his tour of the Fossil House.

The Ulladulla & Districts Community Resources Centre is dedicated to fostering the emotional and physical enrichment and development of members of all ages.

The Centre offers an impressive range of programs, activities, professional classes, and it started as a Neighbourhood Watch in the 80s, the land was given by the Council and also constructed the buildings, the Centre pays the Council a rent and is run under government's guidelines, it started operation in 2009.

What is on offer; Information and referral, Admin support, Group activities, Food store and food parcels (from the Food Bank and also donations from Coles and Woollies), Justice of the Peace, work development orders, free computer tuition, tax help, courses and events.

They help all people who call into the centre, you don't need to be a resident of Ulladulla to ask for help. The building is divided into several sections for privacy and meetings.

Domestic Violence, Alcoholic Anonymous, Narcotic Anonymous, Suicide prevention, the Centre is to be given a car but will have to pay for petrol and insurance.

They accept donations including food ones and raise money by renting the rooms, they apply for grants and have regular Bunnings' BBQs.

The Centre helpers are all volunteers except for Maria.

Quite an informative tour of the Centre, never knew what it does or whom it serves-helps, I am sure a few members didn't know either.

We then walked to the Fossil House, the oldest house in Ulladulla, where we were met by Phil Smart who gave us the history of how and where it started, Phil thanked Glenn Rowen who gave Phil a rent-free shop in the Rowens Arcade and ended up staying two years, now the fossils' new home is in Green Street at the oldest Ulladulla house.
