Vince Ingold, our guest speaker, born and bred in Ulladulla and had a passion for bees since he was in primary school and loves his bees, behind every jar of honey is a hardworking beekeeper, Vince said, he markets his honey under the name of Pointer Mountain Honey, Pointer Road, Yatte Yattah and can be purchased from Milton IGA, petrol station next to Ulladulla Tyre Power and now from the Milton Showground markets.

Queen bees have a short life span, 6 weeks, when a honey bee queen dies, an urgent and unplanned supersedure occurs. Worker honey bees identify several larvae within the proper age range and begin to condition these larvae to become queens.

Beekeeping is not a job for the faint hearted and is very labour intensive. Vince works amongst thousands of bees flying off to collect pollen and nectar. Vince drives up to five hours with the hives to find good grounds and continuously checks the weather forecast. Vince doesn't like draught nor fires because of the potential of loosing bees, which has happened recently.

Moving the bees around to various honey flows is vital to obtain pollen and nectar for their survival, bees have to be inspected regularly as they can get diseases. Varroa mite is not under control in Australia, Vince said, and is pushing for education programs for bee keepers to prevent the spread of parasites and advocates for permits to move hives around.

Vince advised to go for taste of the honey and not the colour, honey will never go off and if you get stung, remove the stinger immediately as it remains active, the longer the stinger stays in the skin, the more venom it releases.
