Meeting Report, 28 February 2023

IPP Tony Fondacaro gave the Club Service report.

Bronwyn Adcock the guest speaker was invited to talk about her experiences in researching and writing her book 'Currowan' and the bushfires of 2019 and 2020. Bronwyn, born in Ulladulla, was investigating the circumstances of the catastrophic bushfires in the Californian towns of Paradise and Concow which were almost completely destroyed in 2018, each losing about 95% of their structures, more than 18,000 structures, mostly within just four hours.

In 2019 Bronwyn was a freelance journalist and a writer, and was interested in fire behaviour and the role of climate change when the fire season started on the NSW East Coast in August 2019. In November that year Bronwyn drove from Canberra and saw smoke in Nelligen from the Currowan fire and was heading to her home west of Bawley Point to prepare her house for the advent of the fire travelling north, which soon swept through her property.

In February 2020 Bronwyn wrote a feature article about the fires and her personal experiences in a journal called 'The Monthly' and soon after was asked to create a book about it. She spent many months searching through maps, charts of temperature, wind, humidity and fire behaviour. Bronwyn interviewed numerous affected residents and RFS volunteers and saw men crying while telling their story. After 18 months the book 'Currowan' was ready to go to the publishers for which she won the Walkley Book Award in 2022.

Bronwyn was impressed with people's kindness after the fires and spoke on PTSD which affected residents, firies and the volunteers. She urged us to look after our planet to minimise the effects of climate change. An excellent address which captivated the entire audience.
