Guest Speaker Rosemary Castle, the District Ambassador for Operation Cleft, Rotarian from RC of Woden Daybreak, came from Canberra to address us. Rosemary said that the Operation Cleft team do make a huge difference to the children at a cost of \$350 per operation, great value for money, and training of professionals is unvaluable. Operation Cleft is a unique Rotary project that provides free cleft repair surgery for underprivileged children in Bangladesh.

Cleft palate and or lip happens when the lip or palate don't join in one side or both sides. Most cases they treat are both sides, clefts are caused by genetic factor, malnutrition, environmental factors, such as exposure to chemicals. In Australia it occurs to one newborn out of 800 and in Asia one in 500.

Operation Cleft helps the poorest of the poor, if left untreated 12% of babies born with clefts die by the age of five or become deaf by the age of twelve as they have problems with eating, swallowing, depression and prone to ENT diseased.


Our club since 2008 helped around twenty children, the \$350 covers the surgeon fees, hospital, medications, ultrasound and x-rays and eventually they lead a normal life. The Rotary Club of Box Hill Central is the driving force behind Operation Cleft and started in 2005.

Operation Cleft Australia's mission is to provide 1,500 free, cleft repair surgeries each year to children enabling them to live normal and meaningful lives.

Children after the operation require speech therapy, ENT care, dietician, paediatrician and orthodontic treatment. More about the program or to donate, check https://www.operationcleft.org.au/home/
