Guest Speakers; Anita Barry (Deputy Principal Ulladulla High School [UHS]), Bill McInnes (Driver Education and Behaviour Programme [Driver Ed] committee member since the early 90s), Senior Constable Jason Mudge (Ulladulla Highway Patrol) and Bill Fraser (Driver Ed treasurer and SES flood rescue), spoke on the benefits of the Driver Ed programme.

The programme was launched in 1991 under the chairmanship of our own **Robin Cantrill**, the then UHS Principal and our Club President, local Policeman **Ken McDonald**, local Ambulance officer **Michael Mastronardi** and UHS teacher **Lyall Gorman** after a number of horrific accidents on the South Coast involving the loss of young people from Ulladulla.

Since the introduction of the programme, there hasn't been any major collision nor loss of life associated with students who attended the programme, which is only run in Milton and Ulladulla area, and was stopped due to COVID for a couple of years. The programme last year involved 39 people and 539 hours, over the six days, 40 students per session, three days per session.

The guest speakers were presented with a cheque for \$10,000, the funds' source involved the Foundation for Rural and Regional Renewal, FRRR, and the Paul Ramsay Foundation. A grant realised through Bill McInnes and Anne Marie Kitchener.

Snr Const Jason Mudge and Anita Barry presented a power point presentation which showed how the three-day programme changes the driving attitude of the year 11 students and the role of the Highway Patrol officers in saving lives. The programme starts at the Ulladulla Netball courts, students are shown by mechanics how to change a tyre and what to do if their car breaks down, the programme improves their driving skills, they are shown the steps needed to obtain a licence, what to do if confronted with an accident, and the role of the Ambulance, Fire and Rescue.

Actual case studies are shown to the students, 80 of them attended the last programme. Students attend the Pheasant Wood Circuit in Marulan, five dual control mini coopers are provided, they are taught the consequences of road trauma, the police role in reducing road trauma, statistics of increased risks of speed, fatigue, alcohol and drugs. They are also exposed to hash braking, understeering, wet weather driving and emergency braking. SES teaches them not to drive through or get into flood waters which can lead to accidents or infections.

Over the years our club was instrumental in keeping the programme running, also with the help of past Rotarian Alan May and wife Cheryl, who provided cars for the students to drive, Jenny and the late Brian Wilkins for their financial support, Mollymook Surf Club for the use of their bus, donations from IMB and the Shoalhaven City Council, help by Kellam Bus Line, Helen, James and Annaleese Kellam and Simon Thistleton.
