Guest Speaker John Willmott was a councillor at the Shoalhaven City Council and during the COVID-19 lockdown went to Kenya where the life expectancy is the lowest on earth. John went to Mombasa, then went North close to Somalia's border and visited the oldest port in Africa; Larney where there are no cars, only donkeys for transport, he then went to Shela village, a touristic area, but because of the pandemic there were no visitors.

Because of the bad drought, they need a bore as they are losing their animals, and one bore can fix their problem, a bore 250 to 300 meters deep. John feels that the Maasai can raise the funds needed by selling cattle and their hand-crafted beads.

John is requesting that the money they raise can be deposited in an account in Rotary's name for credibility.
