Guest Speakers, Annette and Ian Stevens, spoke on the Little Forest Road Project, which came to realisation after the 2019-20 Currajong fires, as they said; one cannot just rely on emergency services to help.

Litte Forest Road is about 8kms long with 12 houses and water reticulation to only the first two kilometres. Residents are taking personal responsibilities and are prepared for the next big fire.

Vinnies, Anglicare, the Red Cross helped their cause and our club helped filling their new water tank (donated by Vinnies). Ian and Anette showed the emergency - water proof bag (Grab n Go Bag) which every resident should have and to fill in case of evacuation with; important documents like insurance, passports, bank records, a USB drive(s) with photos, documents, medication, prescriptions, jewellery, a wind-up/solar radio – torch – charging port ...

Ian and Anette are hoping to get four solar powered cameras to detect fires and contact immediately the RFS.

They finally thanked the Entertainers, Treading Lightly and our club for their support.

The speakers were introduced by President Bernard and thanked by Brian Morrison.
