Guest Speaker, David Heydon, spoke on "Have you thought of adding Antarctica to your bucket list?"

David and Jan came to Narrawallee 44 years ago for their honeymoon and they come back yearly.

David spent 20 years exploring the deep oceans of the world for copper and nickel, which are critical for renewables, he operates in depths of 1,000 to 5,000 meters.

David's passion is Antarctica, which is twice the size of Australia, has more sea ice than land and is bigger than any country, except for Russia.

David is a veteran prospectus, geologist, and is a cruise ship guide, after retiring he has been exploring the North and South Poles.

Ships have a capacity of only 200 people, and once on the ship; you get to see water freezing in front of you, bears, pinguins, whales ... some of the ships have

helicopters, submarines, floating igloos and zodiacs. No one will ever see what you see, as it is everchanging.

Antarctica's ice cap has an average of thickness of 2,1kms, with 1.5kms below the sea level. GPS are a must for fog and blizzards. David was introduced by **Craig Saunders** and thanked by **Simon Brown** for a very informative address.
