Peter is very much involved with cyber security and attack prevention. The Trojan War, 3,300 years ago, when a wooden horse was built and soldiers hid inside it, deception and manipulation.

Peter spoke on phishing emails, praying on exploiting our trust and getting into critical infrastructure. Criminals mainly from Russia, China, North Korea and Iran, countries which protects criminals.

Criminals can intercept emails and change bank accounts details. All can be very helpful in chasing the criminals, but they now use All and can clone your voice and image to produce false videos.

Peter asked us to be well informed but not alarmed, for more information you can look up acma.gov.au and cyber.gov.au for advice and how not to get hacked.
