Ron said that young people aren't very interested in family history, Ron wrote a book on the history of retails, he has uncovered lots of secrets and cemeteries, the Shoalhaven City Council gave them a room at the Civic Centre, lower floor, at a low rent, society members are available Mondays, Wednesdays and Saturday with over 40 members.
