Michael Austin loves to help any generation, has a business called Drawn2Water, where he teaches free diving, offers guided tours locally and overseas.

Michael has spent his whole life in the water, be it surfing, fishing, diving or spear fishing there was never too many moments away from the sea. The amount of time in the water has allowed for slow progression and breath hold adaptation to develop naturally. Holding your breath under water should be easy once you know what to do, as we are mammals once taught you should be able to take a deep breath and exhale it for twice as slow and that will slow down your heart rate, useful for firefighters or if involved in an accident, Michael said we can use this technic to relax and we should make a conscious effort to do it even in our sleep, and it will help you to work through your anxiety using the power of the breath.
