Guest Speaker David Heydon, second visit to our club as a speaker, showed pictures on his Expedition Cruising, some with his wife Jan, they came to Narrawallee 44 years ago while on their honeymoon and been coming back every year since.

David has spent 20 years exploring deep oceans of the world for copper and nickel critical for renewables, he raised privately over half a billion dollars, operated in water depths between 1,000 and 5,000 meters.

When he retired, he started exploring the Polar regions as a guide on ice class expedition ships which takes up to 200 passengers, each ship has a flexible itinerary as they have a start and finish spot but make it up as it depends on the weather and ice.

The Artic has Inuit cultures and villages, is ice surrounded by continents while Antarctica is peaceful and offers scientific opportunities and is a continent double the size of Australia, surrounded by ice.

You always need a GPS once you leave the ship because of fog and snow wipe out. David spoke on the bears who have no fear, no predators and are marine mammals.

The expedition ships cater for all of fitness levels, from participating with everything on offer or you can stay on the ship and watch. Cruises prices vary from \$16,000 to \$30,000. A very interesting address, enjoyed by all.

David was introduced by John Hozack and thanked by John Payne.
