Guest speaker Hamish East with partner Karen are past members of the RC of Kiama, Hamish is a Senior Investigator with the Shoalhaven City Council (SCC) and investigates small rubbish dumping to huge dumping and organised crimes.

Hamish has been on the job for eighteen months and explained what is illegal dumping; rubbish, green waste, house hold rubbish dumped on footpath and contractors who dispose of items illegally without permission, even though we have three waste facilities and seven recycling and transfer stations. Cameras and drones help catching illegal dumping.

Hamish showed dumping stats of the SCC which unfortunately leads all LGAs in the state, perhaps because the low socioeconomic of the area and lots of bushlands. The dumping ranges from construction waste to electronic waste, a total in 2023-24 of 450 tonnes was collected and this financial year it has cost the rate payers over quarter of a million dollars!

President Ed introduced the guest speaker and was thanked by Tim Trescowthick.
