The thoughts I had in my mind on what I would like to see happen in the club in the start of my year was hopefully more community work and also more social activities within the club, I think this was achieved as we did a LOT of service work such as Bunnings BBQs, Willinga Park Campdraft, Charity Poker Run, Driver Ed program, MHERV BBQ fundraiser and helpers assisting the nurse, Lighthouse Gardens Maintenance, 'Park Run', Halloween night Entertainment etc, Cleanup Australia Day, Stage set-up and hiring, Bar work at the Entertainers, Bar stall at BOF, Democracy sausage sizzles and there were some more smaller maintenance jobs done also.

I would also like to thank my Community Director Geoff Johns who has worked tirelessly on All the projects and also the maintenance and organisational skills on our equipment and making sure things are done on time, but he has had a lot of help from Simon Brown.

My Treasurer Bernard Jones, well what can I say about Bernard, he has done a great job keeping the books running very well and received and paid all accounts and they are looking very healthy. We have spent \$34,973 on youth projects some of which are community-based donations, \$15,970 donated to the community, \$400 donated for vocational, \$4,715 donated to International, but I am sure Bernard will give a breakdown on those figures, Bernard has also been a very colourful character and the stories he has told have added much amusement, so thanks Bernard.

To my International Director Tim Trescowthick who has done a brilliant job, he along with a few others organized our Charity Poker Run which I think will only get bigger. This is what I think is one of the hardest portfolios to work on but you have done a great job and its dollars well spent for our youth so keep up the good work.

Our club presented Bill McInnes with the Max Bayliss Award for his work in the community, nurturing young people through his involvement in teaching, SES and the Driver Education program.

International Report

Dear President, members and guests,

It has been my privilege to be director of the International committee for the last 12 months.

During that period the International committee has hosted two functions.

The first was a dinner meeting where the High Commissioner of Pakistan to the Commonwealth of Australia, His Excellency Mr Zahid Hafeez Chaudri, attended and addressed the club. He gave a very interesting and wide-ranging address on his role, Pakistan, and Pakistan- Australia relations, and the current status of polio in Pakistan. This meeting was well attended, with the Mayor of Shoalhaven City Council, several Councillors and the Rotary District 9705 Governor, Rob Uhl, in attendance.

Monies raised on the night were donated to Rotary International's End Polio Now campaign. These funds were doubled by the Gates Foundation.

The following morning, the Ambassador was taken on a tour of the area, with stopovers at Marine rescue Ulladulla, and the Mollymook Surf Lifesaving Club, where interesting talks and tours of the facilities were given. Many thanks to the volunteers of these clubs for hosting the Ambassador.

Later that morning the Ambassador toured Mr Rob Miller's dairy farm where Rob showed the Ambassador his dairy operation. The Ambassador was very keen to investigate the possibility of exporting dairy heifers to Pakistan, a country that cannot produce enough milk to satisfy the population's consumption. Many thanks to Rob for hosting the Ambassador, and to Bernard Jones for accompanying me.

In May the club hosted another Ambassadorial dinner meeting, this time it was the Ambassador of the Kingdom of the Netherlands to Australia, Mrs Ardi Stoios-Braken and her husband, Wayne. The Ambassador gave a very interesting address on her role as ambassador, her studies, and past postings. She also told us how she met and eventually married her Australian husband! This dinner meeting was also well attended, and those in attendance seemed to enjoy the convivial atmosphere. Thanks must go to Ross Wade for helping to muster the large Dutch contingent that were in attendance.

On behalf of the International Committee, I would like to thank Louise Garrett for organising the wonderful raffle hampers, and Gayle and Karlee Dunn and the staff at the Dunn Lewis Centre for the delicious meals that they served up at both functions, while catering for those extra attendees that hadn't RSVPed!

During the year the Club has made the following donations on behalf of the International Committee.

\$4,000 to Eyes for Africa for the purchase of a Tonometer, a device to measure the intraocular eye pressure to monitor for Glaucoma and other eye conditions. This major donation was made to remember the efforts of the late Mr Michael Van Ewijk to the Eyes for Africa cause. Many thanks to Craig Cameron for organising the purchase and delivery of the Tonometer.

\$400 to Operation Cleft. This would have covered the cost of a restorative cleft palate surgery to an underprivileged child in Bangladesh.

\$500 to RAWCS ASSISI project. providing ongoing support to disadvantaged families suffering from extreme poverty and distress in the Greater Masaka Region of Uganda.

The project will support local women who survive by market trading in their endeavour in seeking a small income for basic food items for their family.

\$215 to Rotary International's End Polio Now campaign. As previously mentioned, this donation will be doubled by the Gates Foundation.

I would like to thank the International committee for their efforts during the past 12 months and look forward to hosting some more fundraising activities in the next 12 months.

Youth Report

WOW WHAT A YEAR.

Looking back, it has been a very busy twelve months. The highlight of the past twelve months is the building of the relationship with Ulladulla High School (UHS). In June 2024 members of the Rotary Club including myself attended Ulladulla High School to present a presentation on the Rotary Youth Programs. Please find below a list of Rotary Youth Programs attended by UHS students.

In June 2024, 22 Students from UHS attended the Science and Engineering at University of Wollongong, this is the first time since I have been involved in Youth that I can remember UHS being involved with this program. On the 3rd June UHS again will attend this program hosted by Nowra Rotary Club at Nowra High School.

National Youth Science Forum (NYSF): Chloe Jeffers and Max Monaghan two students from UHS applied and were successful in attending the Forum in January 2025, both Chloe and Max attended a club meeting and spoke on their experiences at NYFS, Max has now changed the direction of his future career, Chloe gained more knowledge for her future career. This year there are two students from Ulladulla who have submitted their details for NYSF.

Anne-Maree Kitchener looks after the Driver Education program, which was launched on 27 July 1991, the Chairperson of the launch was our own Robin Cantrill (Ulladulla High School Principal), panel; Michael Mastronardi (Ambulance), Senior Constable Ken McDonald (Police), Lyall Gorman (UHS teacher) and Adam McInnes (UHS student).

The program teaches students road safety, how to apply for a driver's licence, how to stay safe, vehicle maintenance, changing a tyre, driving skills, driving, first aid, road safety ...

Just under 100 students attended in October 2024, two groups and over two weeks, had a day at the Ulladulla Sport Park then went to Wakefield Park.

Youth Exchange – A recent club visit by Hilma Koskiniemi from Finland being sponsored by Rotary Club of Narooma highlighted this valuable youth program, hopefully our club will be able to re-start this program in the coming years. Will continue to work with International Director Tim Trescowthick on this program.

RYPEN 2025, have received 2 applications from students at UHS, for the RYPEN camp, the camp will be in September 2025. It was great to receive these applications as this has not happened since before COVID-19.

Working with Vocational Director Craig Saunders on two different programs, both programs have been a work in progress. Firstly, with the return of recognising TAFE students with their studies at Ulladulla TAFE campus with a lunch and presentation of certificates to the students, this will once again happen in June 2025.

Finally, Working with Mission Australia in Ulladulla in assisting with renovating the kitchen at the Ulladulla Centre to enable the youths to use more efficiently.

Again, I thank the members of the Rotary Club of Milton-Ulladulla for their ongoing support with the Youth Programs. Looking forward to 2025-26.

Treasurer's Report

The 2024-25 Rotary year has been a big one, from a Treasurer's perspective.

In August our Club handed over the funds held in the Blessing of the Fleet account to the new Committee headed so enthusiastically by Maria Lavalle, this was a total of \$47,143 and signals the passing of the torch after many, many years of Rotary running this iconic Festival.

In my first year as treasurer, it has been a steep learning curve, and I have made it a priority to ensure that all Rotarians spending their own money on Club business have been promptly repaid, and that the Board and members have stayed well informed of our financial position at all times.

As mentioned elsewhere in this bulletin, we have been busy with a number of fund-raising activities including regular Bunnings Bar-B-Ques, other BBQs, bar activities and other one-off events including the Poker Run, Melbourne Cup Sweeps and Surf Club 5km Run.

These activities have allowed the Club to make a number of significant donations.

Our support of the great Driver Education program (\$30,000) included significant community sponsorship, not just our Club funds. Well done to PP Craig Saunders for his passion and skill in organising this sponsorship program. I am pleased to report that the Driver Education program received a \$10,000 grant from IMB Bank which goes a long way to ensuring the ongoing implementation of this wonderful program.

In June, the Club Board approved a \$5,000 grant from Club funds to support the Rotary Club of Taree on Manning to help with their flood recovery works.

We were also happy to donate \$4,000 to the Eyes for Africa program, specifically to purchase a Tonometer to assist in their great work.

Also, a \$5,000 donation was made to the new Blessing of the Fleet committee, specifically to assist them in securing insurance coverage for the event.

And finally, the Club was able to purchase 2 mounted binoculars for the Lighthouse project. The cost of \$8,382 came from long held funds initially donated specifically for this and held in account for a number of years.

The club holds 2 term deposits totalling \$30,000 being held for future activity.

Overall, a busy year with plenty of money coming in, and money going out, and by and large maintaining a steady financial position.

I'd would like to thank President Ed Zonneveldt, Secretary Issa Shalhoub, the Board and all members for their continual efforts and support in allowing us to have such a productive year.

Finally, good luck to incoming President Geoff Johns. I look forward to working with Geoff in what I have no doubt will be an even more productive year.

Community Service Director Report

The Community Service Group had constant work throughout the financial year with the following things;

1. Bunnings BBQs netted \$9,973.40 for the year. This figure is on par with last year's total.
2. The Woolworths Arcade Money Spinner added \$1,099.75 to this year's donations. With an estimated \$400 stolen from it in February, the figure of around \$1,500 would have been achieved which is on par with previous years. Since January 2022 the money spinner has made \$5,777.80 for the club to distribute among local charities.
3. We were offered a position at the Willinga Park Camp Draft to cook breakfast for the entrants and guests and from all accounts it was a big success. We banked over \$4,700 for the four days and everyone had a great time. The Club really tested the BBQ trailer and it handled the job well. The BBQ trailer will be an ongoing upgrade project with new gas bottle clamps fitted, stairs installed for easy access and a folding table arrangement fitted thanks to Simon Brown. I am currently checking prices for signage for the BBQ trailer.
4. The club received a request by Libby Reid from the Milton-Ulladulla orchestra to have two additional stage sections made. A quote was received and accepted by Libby and the Bendigo Bank and work will start on that job soon.
5. I repaired the electrics and cleaned the Stage trailer for registration and with the board's blessing, I am seeking quotes to reconfigure the vinyl top openings to make it a bit more user friendly.
6. The Club held its inaugural 5km Run with over 60 entrants taking part. It was a joint venture with Mollymook Surf Club and their generosity to help the Rotary Club make a great day of it, an extremely admiral gesture, one that won't be forgotten. We held a BBQ on the day and raised over \$2,700. We are currently in talks to organise the run again next year with a bigger and better event.
7. The Community Service portfolio helped with the Yurana Cancer Kids Holiday Houses by removing old swing sets and erecting and placing new ones and fixing some of their cubby houses. Thanks again Simon Brown.
8. Again, many thanks to Simon Brown for his help with the Blessing of The Fleet signage installation and removal in the main street of Ulladulla and his help with tidying up the storage shed, yet again.

Community Service Director Report Cont.

9. I received a request from a Scout Leader regarding a WW11 plane crash on Pigeon House Mountain and it prompted me to start looking at a campaign to erect a memorial on the Mountain for the three Air Force members who lost their lives during a mission in 1943. It will involve Shoalhaven City Council, the Aboriginal Land Council, the Air Force, Milton-Ulladulla RSL Sub Branch, the War Memorial, the Forestry Commission and a host of other vested interested parties.
10. The Club also helped with a Driver Education BBQ in October 2024 at the Ulladulla Sports Park. A great turn out for a wonderful cause.
11. In short, the Community Service Portfolio has helped the club gain a total of \$18,473.15 this year in donations.

I have handed the reins over to Phil Brown regarding the Park Care work at Rotary Park but currently, Rotary and the Council are not on the same page.

I organised two wreaths from Milton Florist to lay at the Dawn Service in Ulladulla and the Morning Service in Milton. Assistance from Jason Russell and John Hozack was greatly appreciated.

I am committed to Rotary's values and its role in the community and my goal for the future is to have better communication, especially with the schools so their needs can be met with the club's help. Also, to increase the clubs standing in the community so that if required, the Rotary Club of Milton-Ulladulla would be the first thought for people wishing to use the services of a charitable organisation.

I want to personally thank every member of the club who has helped me and the Community Service portfolio of the club over the past year and look forward to an even brighter and varied 2025-26 year.
