Coastal Waters' visit where they will give us an EFTPOS card to the value of \$500,

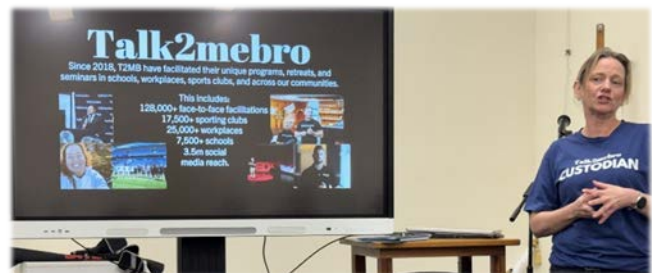
the club needs a President Nominee as Guy Porter will be doing a fair bit of travelling for a while.
