Creating Australia’s next iconic great walk. There are already long-distance walks in Australia throughout the Kimberley etc. David is looking at a long-distance on the South Coast walk. The 660 km of the coast line east coast of Australia, Illawarra escarpment 63km, 11 stages of the walk. The walk starts in Bundeena in the Royal National Park first of 12 National Parks the walk would walk through, Kiama coast, Shoalhaven and Jervis Bay, Jervis – Ulladulla 60km, the Murramarang coast 76km, north Eurobodalla coast 57km, southern Eurobodalla 56km, Mimosas rocks 44kms, the sapphire coast 50km, Ben Boyd national park 66km, stage 11 Nadgee-Howe wilderness 63km – stage 11

NSW doesn’t currently have an iconic walk. New tracks require to complete links, land management to be resolved, numerous water crossing require solutions, eventually signage will need to highlight the coastal walk.

Economic benefits, environmental, socio cultural benefits. Education about regions and history, heritage. A website has been created, a steering committee has been established, finding solutions to logistic issues, have set up a Facebook page to publicise track. The website is great south coast walk.
