**Linda Eadwards** spoke on her life in the Northern Territory, Perth and the various jobs including the Army, Customs and up to recently the Disability Services. Linda is keen to more involved with Rotary.

**Social Director Tony Fondacaro** spoke on the **Triple 0 Ball** names required and **Barefoot Bowls** coming up.



**Dr Ian Lavering** Geologist – retired twelve years ago, has lived in the area for about 10 years. Went back to work about 5 years, working with Government Dept Mineral Resources on the Liverpool Plains. The key is to keep an open mind on resources. Ian works for the Independent Planning Commission. Ian has assisted with a recent discussion with a proposed mine in the Gloucester Valley area of NSW. Value the area and how to make the right decision that is fair to everyone. Ian spoke on how climate change reflects in all discussions. Ian reflected on the time he spent in WA working in the mines.

Ian explained how minerals are created. Resources in Australia are wanted by most of the world. Ian spoke on a few colleagues coming across a ship wreck on the WA coast, the ship wreck was Dutch, the survivors mingle with the Aboriginals in the Top end of WA area.

Ian spoke on the two main resources in Australia of coal and petroleum.

Coal is underneath Sydney, Illawarra, Hunter valley and right into Queensland. To mine the coal and move the coal up and down the coast. In regional NSW freight trains network uses the same as the network as the passenger trains. Federal government don't want other recession so the government is using migrants to assist with the infrastructure work in Australia. We are more dependent on China than they are on us.

Petroleum – 1961 was the first off shore oil rigs, further area of Australia including WA and the great Australia Bight. A reserve near Pelican Island, a bird Sanctuary was used as a bombing range in WW2. In Australia oil wells had been drilled since 1965. Pelican Island had been used a variety of ways with little or no restoration has been done and the island has recovered well. Before debating the project get all the information before saying no.
