Report on meeting of 20 August 2019

PP Brian Morrison opened the meeting welcoming Helena (Exchange Student) members and guest speaker Hamish Richardson.

Almoner Bill Harris informed members Maisie Bennett is doing well and our thoughts are with Zilma Turnbull.

Guest Speaker Hamish Richardson gave a brief introduction of his life so far including being part of a band mainly made up of his brothers and himself working out of Hollywood LA and how he came to be playing the Digeridoo, also creating a sliding Digeridoo during this time in LA, later working for the Times Newspaper and returning to University to qualify as a High School teacher.

Guest speaker Hamish Richardson started working at UHS about 4 years ago and started the Digeridoo group at the school at about the same time, with 3 members growing to 20 members all boys ranging from year 7 to year 10. UHS has a strong Aboriginal education program. The Digeridoo group honours the tradition of the Aboriginal culture through using modern instruments to assist with the basis of the music created by the Digeridoo.



The Digeridoo group are connecting with the Aboriginal cultural. The Digeridoo group up until last year mainly played for the School at assemblies and Functions including NAIDOC week then in 2018 performed the opening at the Southern Stars which includes over 2,000 students from the Illawarra and South Coast region.

Then earlier this year the Digeridoo were invited to Lake Mungo Camp hosted by the community of Lake Mungo only 200 students are able to attend the camp. Students whilst at Lake Mungo are able to attend workshops including bush tucker, boomerang throwing and many other areas of Aboriginal Culture. Whilst at the camp the students taught other students the Digeridoo. Hamish spoke on how the students attending the Digeridoo have formed bonds where the older members look out for the younger members. Students in the group only meet once a fortnight and during the lesson are able to create music to play on didgeridoo and are encouraged to explore their musical side.
