- District Directory has been emailed to all members, a couple of corrections to be made, let Issa know of the errors for him to correct


- Reminder of zoom meetings and deposits of \$5 from members to cover admin whilst we are on Zoom.

Guest Speaker Cooper Lower, BlazeAid Camp Coordinator. BlazeAid is a fully volunteered organisation set up with 24 volunteers at Milton Showground. There are about 145 fences still to be done in the area after the Currowan Fire.

Cooper is a musician by trade and has been volunteering with BlazeAid, since COVID-19 has put Cooper out of work. Cooper spoke on a project he is working towards; Cooper's plan is hoping to host 7 music concerts between here and the Victorian border.

Cooper is also trying to organise a fundraiser for BlazeAid at Milton Showground. Cooper is working around COVID-19 restrictions for these events to go ahead. Cooper is hoping to get back up bands/musicians from the towns where he visits to assist with the concerts and performing. It is tough for BlazeAid volunteers though when COVID-19, people thought that the BlazeAid had closed down.

Cooper would like to let the local community know that BlazeAid is back and getting people together including RFS and other emergency services together.

Charmaine Wheatley spoke on how she met Cooper at Milton Showground, through donating clothes and mentioned how the Rotary family works.

PP Phil Brown spoke on the Lighthouse project and the Lighthouse committee are still waiting for the NSW State government to hand the land to the Ulladulla Land Council so local service clubs can assist with work to be done on the Lighthouse reserve. PP Phil has emailed Shelley Hancock MP to assist with the transfer of Land Title and the fence should be installed in the next few weeks.

'JENNIFER E. JONES NOMINEE FOR 2022-23 PRESIDENT'

Jennifer E. Jones, a member of the Rotary Club of Windsor-Roseland, Ontario, Canada, has been nominated to become Rotary International's president for 2022-23, a groundbreaking selection that will make her the first woman to hold that office in the organization's 115-year history.

Jones will officially become president-nominee on 1 October if no other candidates challenge her.



... As the first woman to be nominated to be president, Jones understands how important it is to follow through on Rotary's Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) Statement. "I believe that diversity, equity, and inclusion ... begins at the top and for us to realize growth in female membership and members under the age of forty — these demographics need to see their own reflection in leadership," Jones said. "I will champion double-digit growth in both categories while never losing sight of our entire family." ...
