President's Report

Rotary Club of Milton-Ulladulla President's Report 2020/2021

Wow what a year! Extremely challenging and eventful. The year started tentatively, with face to face meetings only recently permitted under the strict Covid19 Safety rules of the time. Our Club proactively registered as a Covid Safe organisation, complete with our own QR Code for events and was able to meet, with a Covid Safety Plan in place, under the 4 metre square rule, with no singing, dancing, hand shaking etc. Mandatory signage, attendance recording procedures, temperature checking, hand sanitiser, frequent wiping of the microphone and the occasional glove wearing.

The flexibility of the Club was highlighted when Covid19 restrictions worsened and we went back to zoom meetings for a period of two and a half months. Webmaster Issa Shalhoub ensured the flawless transition to zoom and we enjoyed Guest Speakers on the zoom platform. The resilience and tenacity of Club members led to a productive and fulfilling year. With Covid19 restrictions constantly changing, a Covid19 Safety Plan had to be completed for each activity or event the Club organised.

Sadly we lost Past President Dick Crouch and Past President Brian Johnson this year, as well as other Rotarian family members in sad and sudden circumstances. Club members were there for support and the Rotary family helped each other. Both PP Dick and PP Brian will be missed deeply, their contribution to the Club and the community a credit to them both. A donation of \$700 will be sent to the Cancer Outpatient House Milton in lieu of flowers for PP Dick Crouch.

I did have the privilege of bestowing Honorary membership to Past President Brian Johnson earlier in the year.

I also had the pleasure of rewarding ex Rotarian Peter Hughes with an Honorary membership recently for his many years of driving, maintaining and storing the Life Education Van, as well as providing storage for RCMU property for 20 years..

Community Director, Yvonne Young coordinated 2 working bees at Rotary Park. Water blasting, sanding, painting, straightening posts, fixing broken BBQ tiles and other repair work was carried out. Yvonne arranged for another working bee at Mullala Nursery, with the entire outside of the cottage being painted. The End Trachoma Project caught Yvonne's eye and she began coordinating 25 kits to send to the Northern Territory. Yvonne initiated Bunnings fundraising BBQs. An endeavour our Club now does every 8 weeks. With the decline of public events and fundraising abilities, these BBQs quickly became a good little source of income. Yvonne has also assisted Issa with the weekly Bulletin reports and organised the Guest Speaker gifts and other meeting requirements from the sacred cupboard each week. Thank you Yvonne for your commendable efforts.

Past President Rob Powell was able to run a Calcutta event with the support of the RCMU. The timing allowed for locals to let their hair down and have a Covid Safe outing, after some time in lockdown.

Although Youth events were mostly cancelled due to the pandemic, Avril Pryor was delighted when she was able to put forward a student for the National Youth Science Forum, who later came and spoke at a Club meeting. Avril also organised the Dream Cricket Kit, which was purchased by our Club and will be placed at the Budawang school. Our Club is fortunate to have Avril, her dedication to the community and her values are an inspiration.

As Club members negotiated the Pandemic, there was still much Bushfire Recovery assistance to do. With the generosity of some Rotary Clubs, Churches and businesses, the RCMU was able to continue regular annuity payments to local Fire Impacted families, as well as some local Primary Producers.

I would like to thank all the generous donors, Past President Ross Wade and Bushfire Recovery Chair, John Goggins for their outstanding efforts with this mammoth ongoing task. Over \$200,000 of assistance has been given to deserving locals. More details regarding Bushfire Recovery Assistance is available in John Goggin's report in this booklet.

A need for Mental Health assistance within the community was identified early in the year, post fires with pandemic restrictions severely hampering social connectivity.

A well attended Community Christmas BBQ Fun Day was organised at the newly spruced up Rotary Park. The Rotary Club of Caringbah joined forces with the RCMU and a fun day full of activities was hosted. There was Santa's grotto with Santa and his cheeky elves, with all children receiving a present. There was a delicious BBQ and non-stop games. It was great to see the children enjoying the sack races, treasure hunt and the finale, Santa building in the sand on the harbour. The day was such a success, with so much positive feedback, our Club and the Rotary Club of Caringbah spoke of doing it again in 2021.

A slight lift in Covid19 restrictions permitted a Formal to go ahead for the Blessing of the Fleet Princesses of 2020. The Ulladulla Blessing of the Fleet Festival and Blessing Ceremony had to be cancelled for Easter, however a scaled down event, in place of the traditional Ball was organised early December, giving the Princesses a chance to wear the gowns they had purchased ten months before. Dancing restrictions eased at midnight the day before the Ball, allowing 50 people on the dance floor. A new Covid19 Safety Plan was written that day and the night was a huge success. Congratulations to the Princess of the Fleet, Maddi Healy, second runner up Charlotte Dedden and third runner up Indigo Violaris.

The Blessing of the Fleet Festival attracted attention from cameraman / producer Michael Pignataro, choosing to highlight the Festival in his pilot series - 'Living On The Coast' aired on WIN4.

These 2 significant Community events in December 2020 were morale boosting for a community smashed by the fires, then floods, pandemic and a tragic accident and death of a high school student. It was great to see the smiling faces of children and families at the Community Christmas BBQ and the Blessing of the Fleet Princess Formal.

With some easing of Covid19 restrictions, the Italian Fishing Community was able to proceed with a private Blessing of the Fleet Ceremony Easter Sunday 2021. Plans are underway for a Blessing of the Fleet Princess Ball in November this year. Providing an opportunity for the Princesses of 2021 to shine in the absence of the usual Street Parade and Festival, for the second year. New Ball Chair Clare Nyholm will be coordinating the traditional event this year, taking over from Past President Brian Morrison, who has held the position for over 10 years. Thank you for your service and dedication PP Brian and all the best to Clare in her new role.

I will continue to Chair the Ulladulla Blessing of the Fleet Festival and am hopeful for a Festival in 2022.

To further assist with Mental Health, a Community Chest was established by the RCMU for crisis assistance, via the Ulladulla Resource Centre. The Community Chest has already assisted several local individuals experiencing hardship and will be an ongoing initiative.

The mental health of our own members was not overlooked. Past President Michael Matronardi kindly called to 'check in' on all Rotarians at the beginning and towards the end of the Rotary year. This was very well received by Club members. Thank you PP Michael.

Further to Past President Michael's efforts, Rotarian Bill Harris did a splendid job with the Almoner. Bill regularly called and checked on ill members and reported back to the Club each week. Thank you Bill.

The RCMU have been working closely with Bernardos Southern Shoalhaven to identify local people who have fallen through the cracks and who are in need of assistance, providing funds through the Bushfire Recovery annuities and the RCMU Community Chest.

Past President Tim Gregory and his family managed to grow a bumper crop of live Christmas trees with the help of an irrigation system and luckily escaped the unrelenting fires. Total Christmas Tree sales came to an unprecedented \$8,500. A tremendous effort from the Gregory's. Well done, a big thank you Tim and family and all Rotarians rostered on for the sales.

Rotarian Emile Jansen held a successful Comedy night, raising around \$4,000. This was the second Comedy event held with the non-profit company 'Comedy for a Cause'. The Comedians were of top calibre, coming from Sydney and Melbourne Comedy Festivals. I would like to thank Emile for his efforts and the volunteers on the night.

The RCMU are 1 of 4 Rotary Clubs who produce the Shoalhaven Emergency Services Community Awards (SESCA). This is the only Award event which recognises all first responders in the Shoalhaven. Congratulations to all the finalists and winners. A highly commendable effort by all emergency services in what has been a very difficult year. The SESCO Awards are a fantastic forum to acknowledge, thank and honour our first responders, whilst boosting morale and wellbeing. A shout out to Yvonne Young for nominating 3 people.

The RCMU recognised the value in supporting the documentary film 'We Are Conjola.' Over 33 locals feature in the documentary, telling their stories of survival. It was a process which helped with their healing, providing a platform to share their experiences as well as show how

they have worked through their trauma through creative outlets such as poetry, song, art and sculpture. An insightful film, which has gone on to receive many national and international accolades. Director / Producer Anthony Ash Brennan, along with local poet and survivor Stephen Chinnock and local songstress and survivor Lygiah Fowler, who both feature on the film, came to a meeting, where RCMU members were treated to a private screening of the film, a live performance of an original song, 'Charcoal Soul' by Lygiah and original poetry recital by Stephen. It was compelling and raw, as well as validating for all guests.

Rotarian John Payne organised another profitable Car Boot Sale & Swap Meet at Milton Showground, raising around \$4,000 and attracting a healthy crowd. Fantastic effort and result, as usual John and all the volunteers on the day.

A Grudge Tennis match was held between the RCMU and the Ulladulla Milton Lions Club. A new stunning trophy named in honour of Rotarian Past President Dick Crouch and Lion Past President, Past District Governor, Secretary Allan McDonald. (Who also sadly passed away this year). The RCMU took out the trophy and presented it to Jean Crouch. Ann McDonald was also in attendance.

Another highlight of the year was the Combined Service Club Dinner Meeting, hosted by our Club. The Ulladulla Milton Lions Club and the Milton Ulladulla Apex Club came along for a fun night of laughter, a bit of stirring, fellowship, and mutual respect. Each President spoke on the year that was and the year ahead. A representative from each Club spoke on the benefits of the pandemic, providing hilarious commentary. The evening was a huge success with over seventy five people in attendance, the raffle money being pooled for a mutual local cause and pledges by all who came, to do it again soon!

President Elect Tony Fondacaro instigated a Calendar fundraiser with the local chemists of Ulladulla, showing great initiative. PE Tony also ran barefoot bowls for the men of the Club and organised the weekly raffle prizes.

Past President Keith Bennett, Rotarian Simon Brown and President Elect Tony Fondacaro assisted with the collection of money, re-location and maintenance of the Money Spinner, which is now located in the Ulladulla Shopping Complex and provides some income for the Club.

Vocational Services Director Bernard Jones organised an Apprentice of the Year Award. A welcomed initiative in the absence of Youth programs and Business Awards.

The Club was recently successful with a grant towards the purchase of a defibrillator. The Defib will be located inside the Dunn Lewis Centre.

The last project completed in my Presidency was the planting of 225 trees in the Yatte Yattah area. The Rotary Club of Darling Harbour arranged the itinerary and seedlings from the local Landcare, with 3 properties receiving a variety of native trees. It was a rewarding weekend. The owners of the properties were visibly emotional and grateful for the help and it was a great sense of achievement. Both Clubs planted over 100 trees for 100 Years of Rotary in Australia.

Community Service Director Report

The 2020-21 Community Service Year began with nine nominations for the Shoalhaven Emergency Services Community Awards (SESCA), these awards give thanks to our first responders. With two nominations winning their section now go onto 2021 State Finals.

The winning nominations for 2020 were Senior Constable Douglas Nyholm and Paramedic Peter Arndell, both men are worth winners and give so much to the community. There are three nominations for the SESCO awards in 2021. All the best for these nominations.

In June 2020, three nominations were sent to Rotary International Women's Award though none were successful, it was a great experience for all involved.

After being able to plan for working bees at Rotary Park and Mullala Nursery, working bees were finally able to be conducted in October and November 2020. Rotary Park was given a quick make over in October and Mullala Nursery was painted over two days in November 2020.

Vocational Service Report

2020-21 has been an 'interesting year', particularly in the Vocational Services Area. With the ever-changing COVID situation, businesses throughout the country have had a tumultuous time trying to stay up on the latest advice regarding social distancing, contact tracing and QR code scanning, all terms that barely existed 18 months ago.

In our area, with such a reliance on visitors, the issues are even greater arising from the fear of 'where have the visitors come from?' and 'will they bring COVID-19 to us?'

As a result, the traditional Rotary Vocational Services activities such as site visits and guest speakers from industry have been taken off the table.

Similarly, a planned mentoring partnership program with Ulladulla High School to run with the Youth Services team never got off the ground, but the idea remains worthy, and we intend to explore opportunities with this, once restrictions are sufficiently eased.

The key activity of this division of the Club in the past was the Annual Business Awards.

As these have now been taken away from Rotary and are in the hands of the local Business Chamber.

One element of this event which we have reintroduced is a local Apprentice and Trainee of the Year Award. In early June we were happy to award an apprentice baker from Ulladulla, Beau Pender as the Rotary Club of Milton-Ulladulla 2021 Apprentice of the Year.

We intend to build on this year's success to run the program in 2022.

2022 offers great opportunities to increase engagement with local business to raise the Club profile and help with local programs.

We look forward to things 'returning to normal' as our community, and the nation emerges from COVID restrictions, through increased vaccination numbers.

I thank President Leonie Corrin-Smith for her efforts this year and wish our new Club President, Tony Fondacaro every success as we stand ready to support him in his endeavours.

Youth Report

The year proved challenging for everybody, with Covid 19 causing the cancellation of many Youth programs.

This year we were unfortunate to not be able to sponsor the outward-bound program with the ongoing Covid 19 situation. This program has been suspended until 30th June 2022.

RYLA was cancelled this year due to Covid 19 and will be resuming from the 8th until the 14th January 2022 in Canberra. I have notified Ulladulla High School and hopefully we will have a young person being introduced to the concepts of effective leadership.

In May we had the honour of one student applying for the National Youth Science Forum. Jaimee Soo was the successful applicant and participated in the program in January 2022. Jaimee later returned to the club to speak on her experience at National Youth Science Forum.

The Youth Committee made donations to the local Primary and High Schools for their annual presentation days.

Unfortunately, this year saw the cancellation of the RYPEN camps. Preparations are already underway with the program returning in Wagga on the weekend of the 12th to 14th November 2021. I hope to be able to send some students to attend this great program.

The Driver Education program was also cancelled this year due to Covid 19, however we look forward to returning to this program later this year. Many thanks go to Michael Mastronardi for his dedication for ensuring our young adults have excellent driver safety education. My thanks also go to Rebecca Cameron who volunteered her time on weekends to assist the youth in getting their L and P Plates.

OTHER FOCUSED DONATIONS

To the credit of our club, despite the vicissitudes of the year, we have been very generous in our support of several worthy causes both locally and internationally. These donations have been cited in other reports.

In particular the club has noted the serious issues in our community related to mental health problems. Some of these may be attributed to the recent traumas of fires and pandemic conditions. As an initiative the club has helped establish a community chest structure in coordination with the local Ulladulla Community Resources Centre. This funding was in response to a serious gap in local social support structures. These funds have already been accessed regularly by needy persons within our community. It is hoped that this program will continue.

Likewise, the club has supported a grant application by the Resources Centre to establish a base for a focussed suicide prevention worker. Although the initiative will only last until the end of the funding period (December, 2021) it is hoped that there may be a way by which this initiative will be able to continue with other funds in the future.

2019 - 2020 Bushfires

Throughout President Leonie's tenure, the Club continued its strong support of local persons and businesses devastated by the December 2019 and January 2020 bushfires.

Notwithstanding the difficulties posed by Covid-19, 'all up' a total in excess of \$225,000 in monetary donations and in kind has been distributed to those most in need.

This included:

1. \$85,380 by way of monthly 'annuity' payments to particularly needy individuals, couples and families, all of whom had lost their homes;
2. \$27,650 of local business purchases to support local primary industry with damaged infrastructure and other fire related 'issues';
3. \$17,400 of local business purchases for a range of 'one off' assistance (including tools of trade, plants, landscaping, etc., lost in the fires, along with local business vouchers for everything from hardware and groceries to café purchases);
4. \$5,800 to Blaze Aid and to support the film "We Are Conjola"; and
5. The provision of three modern caravans for family and individual accommodation.

In particular, over the past eighteen months, the community of Hervey Bay in Queensland has donated in excess of \$50,000 to provide monthly support payments to three families, six couples and three individuals.

Locally, the Uniting Church supported a family of four and a couple. The Millhouse Art Society (and collaborators) supported two families, a couple and an individual, and our very own Gregory Family's Christmas Trees 'production' fully supported a family of four and partially supported three other families (in conjunction with other donors).

Also, Emile Jansen, has secured substantial pledges from District and others to support upcoming local bushfire recovery community infrastructure works and has most generously provided 'gratis' architectural services as an integral part of securing these future funds.
