This year marks the 66th Blessing of the Fleet Princess Ball, and we welcomed 34 Princesses and their partners. I am very proud of these young people and the commitment both they and their families made to making the ball a success. I have to mention the beautiful and capable Matilda Sinclair and her Partner Logan Marsh - they were on hand to help throughout the preparations and were excellent mentors to the ball participants.

This year's Ball Committee - Leonie Smith, Bev Nicholas, Louise Garrett, Avril Prior put in many hours organising everything from crowns and sashes, table arrangements and decoration, arbours, flowers, gifts for partners, ticketing, dance practices (there were many of those!) and making sure the participants knew exactly where to go, how to get there, how to stand once they got there, and how to leave (gracefully). Some of these young men and women have never worn a suit, high heels or a tie - and the way they presented themselves on the night is an absolute credit to them, and of course all the hard work it took to get them there! We saved a significant amount of money on flowers this year, thanks to Bev and Louise, who managed to bring on board two local businesses including a local wildflower supplier - Gooloo Creek - to supply all the greenery for the table decorations and stage displays at an excellent price. I am proud of this partnership, not only because we supported local producers - but also one that lost significantly during the bushfires - our club has actually spent time planting trees on the Gooloo Creek Property late last year.

And they weren't the only local helpers we found that not only did a magnificent job, but at a discounted price - Dean Dampney took what I believe to be the BEST ball photos I have ever seen, along with the Milton Ulladulla Videography Club who supplied us with a fully edited video of the night. Evie and Matilda Sinclair ran a raffle of two bikes that added to our overall tally. Of course, whilst we did make some significant savings this year, our profits are down on previous years as we have had no sponsors for the Princesses (as there was no parade). The great thing is next year's parade will be back, and possibly the largest number of floats EVER due to the willingness of a number of Princesses from this year wanting to be a part of the 2023 Parade.

2021-22 Vocational Services Report

2021-22 has again been a challenging year thanks to the continuing disruption of the COVID virus.

The months of August and September were a complete write-off with Covid shutdowns. From October, the situation improved with local travel reintroduced and a gradual reduction in restrictions such as gathering numbers, QR scanning and mask requirements. Despite an excellent uptake of vaccinations, businesses have had to remain cautious to avoid the dreaded 'positive test' and subsequent 14 day, later reduced to 7-day, isolation periods.

Last year's Apprentice and Trainee of the Year was not able to be run this year. Hopefully it can be reintroduced later in the next Rotary year.

Traditional Rotary Vocational Services activities such as site visits and guest speakers from industry were again unable to be organised this year. Organisations such as the Fire Brigade, Ambulance Service, State Emergency Service and Marine Rescue are all keen to host Rotary events, once they are able to do so.

We look forward to things 'returning to normal' as our community, and the nation emerges from COVID restrictions and businesses feel more comfortable in reintroducing additional activities.

I thank President Tony Fondacaro for his efforts this year and wish our new Club President Rebecca Cameron every success as we stand ready to support her in her endeavours.

To the incoming Vocational Services Director, Yvonne Young, I wish her all the best and again look forward to supporting her in the delivery of her vision for the role.


This coming year donations will be made to the Mark Etheridge Youth Scholarship to ensure disadvantage youth can reengage with society and their studies.
